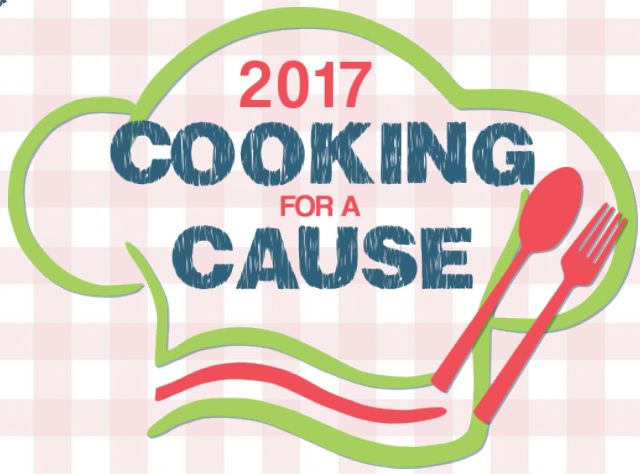

Welcome to the third annual "Cooking for a Cause" at the beautiful Frutig Farms!



We bring together local stakeholders to focus on our community's most challenging issues, such as quality of life for our aging population, prisoner re-entry, and child sexual abuse.
